

Children's Programs

We care about the overall academic success of our students. In French schools and French Immersion programs, student performance in all subjects can be affected by French competency. We offer programs that are focused, supportive, and engaging. As well as our very successful academic programs, we offer homework and remedial assistance to all students.

Tutoring Options

Private and Semi-private:

These classes normally supplement students' regular classroom learning by providing a structured approach and homework help. We have also developed programs for early/middle/late immersion learners, and for students with special needs such as those with dyslexia or ADD. Semi-private classes are a cost effective alternative for students at similar levels and learning styles.

Group Drama

To encourage speaking in French, we offer a very popular group drama program. These classes are excellent for children that have a good French base but would benefit from speaking in a fun, exciting environment. Group sizes are small, so all students have many opportunities to become involved and build confidence.

Summer Camp

We have been providing summer camps for many years, and they are very successful in helping students refresh their French skills so when they start school ready to learn. This often leads to early success in French at school, which builds their confidence and leads to further success in all their subjects. The summer camp program is further outlined in a separate PDF document.

Program Details

We use the same graduated reading programs as most French and Immersion schools, i.e. 26 level GB+. We also encourage and motivate students to read more by having fun and celebrating their successes e.g. a pie in their teacher's face for reading x amount of books. Our 19 level graduated writing program starts with writing out sounds, followed by correct word spelling, and then progresses to complete sentences.

We believe in regular communication regarding student progress, so our teachers meet with parents for the last 5 minutes of each lesson to discuss work done, progress, and areas for further work.

Registration periods parallel school terms, with no classes during Christmas and March Break (see schedule below). Our classes are hourly, and are offered from Monday to Friday from 4pm to 9pm. We also teach on weekends and during the summer depending on teacher availability. We teach during all other holidays (e.g. Thanksgiving), as we believe that learning continuity for students is very important.

We teach students of all ages and French abilities, including pre-immersion, immersion, core, and college/university. Students may sign up for each term separately or for all terms, and students may start or join classes at any time. Discounts are available based on total registration. We also offer a weekly homework club class for students who are absent due to sickness. Registrations are on a first come first serve basis and reserved when paid.
